SALT and LIGHT- In today's gospel Jesus uses two metaphors to communicate the deeper meaning and implication of the gospel such as salt of the earth and light of the world. Our everyday life experiences inform us that salt lends flavour to food items. Similarly salt was used to season and preserve food. Salt is a powerful element that is renowned as a purifier in the Bible. When the people complained to Elisha about the contaminated water of the well that had caused the land to be unfruitful, the prophet cast some salt into the water saying, this is what the LORD says: I have purified this water; from now on it will no longer cause death or infertility (2Kings 2:19). The qualities of salt should be the spiritual qualities of being a disciple. Salt adds quality and flavour to food when it is merged with the food. It is indistinguishable from the rest of the food, but its presence or absence is noticed immediately. In the same way, the disciples of Jesus can only be truly effective when they are fully part of society while, at the same time, adding an unmistakable flavour to the community where they live into their discipleship rooted in the Gospel.

Light was the first thing God created. At the very beginning of creation, there was darkness all over the world but God created light and separated it from darkness (Gen. 1:3-5). Light represents goodness, joy and peace while darkness represents evil, sorrow and wickedness. Jesus calls himself the light of the world and those who follow him will not walk in darkness (Jn 8:12). St. Paul exhorts the Christians in Philippi "to be blameless and innocent in the midst of a crooked and perverse generation, among whom you shine like lights in the world" (Phil 2: 15). The images of light and salt illustrate the positive role that we, as disciples of Jesus, are called to play in the world. In the words of the great French novelist, Albert Camus, 'The world today needs Christians who remain Christians'. Fr Saju.
