



This week in prayer and liturgy we were looking at the gospel reading where the rich man asks how he can reach the kingdom of God. The rich man was quite taken aback when Jesus said that he must give up all his possessions but Jesus explained that we need to focus on putting others first not fixating on our possessions. Ask the children to explain what Jesus meant by saying it was harder for a rich man to enter the kingdom of heaven than for a camel to go through the eye of a needle.
