





OUR NEW POPE



Yesterday on the 8th May, after just two days of voting in the conclave, white smoke appeared from the chimney above the Sistine Chapel and the bells rang out, signalling that a new pope had been elected. Cardinal Robert Prevost has been elected as the 266th Successor of Saint Peter and he will be taking the name 'Pope Leo XIV'. He has chosen the name Leo. The last pope with this name was Pope Leo XIII, over one hundred years ago, whose work was the basis for Catholic Social Teaching. A big part of our Catholic life teaching in school.

He is the first pope from North America and the first pope who is a member of the Augustinian religious order. As we celebrate this Year of Jubilee when we are called to be Pilgrims of Hope, we give thanks that Pope Leo will continue to speak up for those who are poor or marginalised in our world. In his first speech, Pope Leo said, 'We are disciples of Christ, Christ goes before us, and the world needs his light. Humanity needs Christ as a bridge to be reached by God and his love. Help us, and help each other, build bridges.'

NATIONAL OUTDOOR CLASSROOM DAY - THURSDAY 8 MAY

Yesterday we celebrated National Outdoor Classroom day. Every child had the opportunity to take part in a timetable of events organised by Mrs Lucas. VE DAY

We marked this celebration with various activities in class and a two-minute silence across the school. ARC held an afternoon picnic tea for the children, which included cheese and cucumber sandwiches. They all loved being part of this special celebration!
